The controlled environment agriculture industry is growing rapidly in Virginia because it enables year-round planting in indoor spaces and uses fewer resources. Crops, such as this snacking pepper plant, are grown vertically, rather than in traditional, horizontal rows, which means more crops can be grown in fewer acres,



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increasing a farm's sustainability.

Bingyu Zhao, a professor in the School of Plant and Environmental Sciences, and **Yun Yin**, an assistant professor in the Department of Food Science and Technology, are the masterminds."







ith funding from two grants by the United States Department of Agriculture estimated at a total of more than \$360,000, **Srdjan Acimovic**, an assistant professor in the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences' School of Plant and Environmental Sciences, is developing new effective treatments for fire blight — more specifically, fire blight bacterium Erwinia amylovora in fire blight cankers. Cankers are infected dead zones on wood bark and often cause up to 50 percent of losses of orchard acreage."
